Impact MBA Funding Opportunities

Impact MBA Program Scholarships:

Gold, Impact, Sustainability, Green, and International Scholarship

Award Amount:	Gold Scholarship: \$9,000 per semester (up to \$27,000 for Impact MBA and up to \$36,000 for Impact/MFIN Dual Degree) Impact Scholarship: \$5,000 per semester (up to \$15,000 for Impact MBA and up to \$20,000 for Impact/MFIN Dual Degree) Sustainability Scholarship: \$3,000 per semester (up to \$9,000 for Impact MBA and up to \$12,000 for Impact/MFIN Dual Degree) Green Scholarship: \$1,000 per semester (up to \$3,000 for Impact MBA and up to \$4,000 for Impact/MFIN Dual Degree) International Scholarship, variable.
About the Award:	As funding allows the Impact MBA Scholarship Committee awards one or more of these scholarships based on the merit of the applicant.
Qualifications:	You must be accepted into the Impact MBA program and must submit a GMAT or GRE test. Test scores must be submitted directly to Colorado State University (school code 4075) from the testing centers. You must maintain good academic standing (3.0 or higher) to keep the award.
To Apply:	All admitted students meeting qualifications will be automatically considered for these scholarships. Applications received by the early priority deadline will be given preference.

International Programs Global Partnership Award

Award Amount:	Guaranteed 1/3 off the non-resident base tuition per semester for all admitted students (@\$4,600 value each semester)
Deadline:	Applying by the priority deadline is recommended.
About the Award:	Colorado State University offers scholarships to qualified international candidates to participate in on-campus Academic Programs at CSU. This scholarship may be combined with other scholarships, but it is not combinable with a graduate assistantship.
Qualifications:	You must be accepted into the Impact MBA program and must submit a GMAT or GRE test. Test scores must be submitted directly to Colorado State University (school code 4075) from the testing centers. You must maintain good academic standing (3.0 or higher) to keep the award.
To Apply:	All admitted students meeting qualifications will be automatically considered for these scholarships. Applications received by the early priority deadline will be given preference.

Qualifications: You must be accepted into the Impact MBA program in order to access the application for these scholarships. You must maintain good academic standing (3.0 or higher) to keep the award.

Impact MBA Alumni Scholarship

Award Amount: Variable

Deadline: Early priority deadline Dec. 1, final deadline Feb. 1

About the Award: The purpose of the Fund is to provide scholarships for students in the IMPACT MBA Program established and funded by over 100 Impact MBA alumni.

Qualifications: Be enrolled as a full-time, on-campus/in-person graduate student in the IMPACT MBA Program;

- Have an undergraduate GPA of at least 3.50 or a GMAT score of at least 700;
- Must submit a GMAT or GRE test. Test scores must be submitted directly to Colorado State University (school code 4075) from the testing centers.
- Maintain an IMPACT MBA GPA of at least 3.50.



To Apply: You must complete the application found at this site: CSU Scholarship Applications (CSUSA). The CSUSA will be available online on your RAMweb beginning Dec. 1 and the deadline is March 1.

Peace Corps Coverdell Fellowship

Award Amount: For out-of-state: \$35,000*
For in-state: \$24,000*
These amounts include a scholarship, assistantship stipend, health insurance premium, and the application fee.

Deadline: Early priority deadline Dec. 1, final deadline Feb. 1
Applications received by the early priority deadline will be given preference.

About the Award: The Peace Corps Coverdell Fellowship includes a discount to in-state tuition rates (if applicable) plus a graduate assistantship. Read more information about the assistantship requirements. In the third semester, there is an internship requirement as well.

Qualifications: The Impact MBA Scholarship Committee awards up to two of these fellowships based on the applicant's merit. You must be accepted into the Impact MBA program to be considered for the award and must submit a GMAT or GRE test. Test scores must be submitted directly to Colorado State University (school code 4075) from the testing centers. You must maintain good academic standing (3.0 or higher) to keep the award.

To Apply: Please indicate in your resume on your application to the Impact MBA program that you were a Peace Corps Volunteer, and complete the application for a Graduate Assistantship. You are also required to submit your official Peace Corps Description of Service (DOS) as an additional page with your resume in your application to the program. For currently serving volunteers, attach a letter from your Country Director specifying you are in good standing.

Please note that the information provided in the assistantship application will be used for matching you to a professor or unit, but the award decision will be based on your application to the Impact MBA program.

Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) Program

Award Amount: Colorado State University offers four program awards to cover one half of nonresident tuition (approximately \$12,000), for fall and spring enrollment only, to graduate students of any discipline.

About the Award: APEC Program Awards expand education and training opportunities for students, especially women, from developing economies. Applicants must be from any Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) economy. See the member list below.

Qualifications: To be considered for the APEC Program Award, applicants must first be admitted to a degree-seeking, on-campus, graduate level program at Colorado State University.



To Apply: Complete this APEC scholarship application with the Office of International Programs

Member Economies: Australia, Brunei, Canada, Chile, People's Republic of China Hong Kong, China, Indonesia, Japan, Republic of Korea Malaysia, Mexico, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Peru, The Philippines, Russia, Singapore, Chinese Taipei, Thailand, The United States, Vietnam

Community Impact Award

Award Amount: The amount and number of awards per year is based on availability of funding and will vary from year to year

Deadline: May 15

About the Award: You must be accepted into the Impact MBA program and must submit a GMAT or GRE test. Test scores must be submitted directly to Colorado State University (school code 4075) from the testing centers. You must maintain good academic standing (3.0 or higher) to keep the award.

Qualifications: All admitted students to the Impact MBA program will be eligible to apply for this scholarship. This scholarship is combinable with other scholarships and assistantships.

To Apply: Admitted students will be required to submit a one-page essay to the Program Manager: shelby.sack@colostate.edu before May 15. Please choose from the prompts below:

- Can you share specific details on how you have contributed to your community?
- Tell us about a time where you challenged your pre-existing worldview. Why? Would you do this again?
- How has the environment where you grew up molded you into the person you are today?

Matthew Hammerdorfer Memorial Scholarship

Award Amount: \$3,000, to be applied to the total cost of the three-semester program.

Deadline: Early priority deadline Dec. 1, final deadline Feb. 1

About the Award: This scholarship was established to honor the life and the love of Matthew Hammerdorfer through the generosity of his parents who were both former College of Business leaders. Matthew's father, Carl Hammerdorfer, was the first director of this unique MBA program and Matthew's mother, Kathy Lynch, worked in Education Abroad. Matthew intended to follow in the footsteps of his parents and join the Peace Corps. He truly lived the phrase "carpe diem" by embracing opportunities, dreaming big and being a kind and caring individual. He looked forward to continued travels, especially to Africa.

Qualifications: You must be a citizen of a country within the African continent, accepted into the Impact MBA program and must submit a GMAT or GRE test. Test scores must be submitted directly to Colorado State University (school code 4075) from the testing centers. You must maintain good academic standing (3.0 or higher) to keep the award.



To Apply: You must complete the application found at this site: CSU Scholarship Applications (CSUSA). The CSUSA will be available online on your RAMweb beginning Dec. 1 and the deadline is March 1.

Organization of American States Global Partnership Award

Award Amount: Guaranteed 1/3 off the non-resident base tuition per semester for all admitted students (@\$4,600 value each semester)

Deadline: The final deadline to apply for the OAS scholarship is May 1st. However, applying before Feb. 1st is recommended for consideration of other Impact MBA scholarship funding.

About the Award: In partnership with the Organization of American States (OAS), Colorado State University offers scholarships to qualified candidates of the Americas to participate in on-campus Academic Programs at CSU. **This scholarship may be combined with other scholarships, but it is not combinable with a graduate assistantship.**

Qualifications: All students who are admitted to Colorado State University and are from an OAS member country (excluding the U.S.) are guaranteed this Global Partner Award. For a complete list of eligible countries and requirements, please visit [the Office of International Programs website](#).

To Apply: Complete this OAS application form with the Office of International Programs

AmeriCorps Matching Scholarship

Award Amount: Up to 5 awards per cohort of \$1,500 per person to be split out equally between the semesters in the program as funding allows.

Deadline: Applicants must be admitted prior to the February 1st priority deadline to be considered for this AmeriCorps award and must submit a GMAT or GRE test. Test scores must be submitted directly to Colorado State University (school code 4075) from the testing centers. You must maintain good academic standing (3.0 or higher) to keep the award.

About the Award: To support applicants who have completed service with the AmeriCorps program, the Impact MBA will match the Segal AmeriCorps Educational award of up to \$1,500 for up to 5 students per cohort.

Qualifications: Any admitted student to the Impact MBA program who completed Americorps service may apply. A scholarship review committee made up of staff will review the applicants based on Academic Council approved scoring criteria (academic aptitude, academic achievement, ability to contribute to the cohort learning experience, quality of application, and letters of recommendation.)

To Apply: Please provide verification of service by logging into your AmeriCorps account and by emailing your “AmeriCorps Service Letter” to shelby.sack@colostate.edu. This should be sent by the February 1st priority



application deadline. The letter must include the following information: Name, Dates of service, General program information
