## Impact MBA Funding Opportunities

### Organization of American States Scholarship

- Award Amount:** \$50,000, to be applied to the total cost of the three-semester program.
- Deadline:** Early priority deadline Dec. 1, final deadline Feb. 1
- About the Award:** The Organization of American States (OAS), through the Department of Human Development, Education and Employment and Colorado State University, through the OAS Partnerships Program for Education and Training, are offering scholarships to qualified candidates of the Americas. This scholarship may be combined with other scholarships, but it is not combinable with a graduate assistantship.
- Qualifications:** You must be accepted into the Impact MBA program to be considered for this scholarship, and you must maintain good academic standing (3.0 or higher) in order to keep the award. You also must be a citizen and/or permanent legal resident of any OAS member state, except the United States of America.
- To Apply:**

### Organization of American States Global Partnership Award

- Award Amount:** 1/3 off the non-resident base tuition per semester
- Deadline:** Early priority deadline Dec. 1, final deadline Feb. 1
- About the Award:** The Organization of American States (OAS), through the Department of Human Development, Education and Employment and Colorado State University, through the OAS Partnerships Program for Education and Training, are offering scholarships to qualified candidates of the Americas. This scholarship may be combined with other scholarships, but it is not combinable with a graduate assistantship.
- Qualifications:** All students who are admitted to Colorado State University and apply to Organization of American States. You must be accepted into the Impact MBA program to be considered for this scholarship, and you must maintain good academic standing (3.0 or higher) in order to keep the award. You also must be a citizen and/or permanent legal resident of any OAS member state, except the United States of America.

## Impact, Sustainability, and International Scholarship

Award Amount:	\$15,000 Impact Scholarship, to be applied to the total cost of the three-semester program. \$9,000 Sustainability Scholarship, to be applied to the total cost of the three-semester program. \$3,000 Green Scholarship, to be applied to the total cost of the three-semester program. International Scholarship, variable.
About the Award:	As funding allows, the Impact MBA Scholarship Committee awards one or more of these scholarships based on the merit of the applicant.
Qualifications:	You must be accepted into the Impact MBA program to be considered for a scholarship. You must maintain good academic standing (3.0 or higher) in order to keep the award.
To Apply:	All admitted students will be considered for these scholarships. Applications received by the early priority deadline will be given preference.

## Graduate Assistantship in Student Affairs

- Award Amount:** Tuition assistance (see SAHE program administrators for details)
- Deadline:** April 1
- Qualifications:** Each year, several Student Affairs assistantships are available to graduate students who are not enrolled in the SAHE (Student Affairs in Higher Education) graduate degree. Incoming Impact MBA students with a background or interest in Student Affairs should consider applying. This assistantship is not combinable with a College of Business assistantship.

## Peace Corps Coverdell Fellowship

- Award Amount:** For out-of-state: \$37,900\*  
For in-state: \$16,600\*  
These amounts include a scholarship, assistantship stipend, health insurance premium, and the application fee.
- Deadline:** Early priority deadline Dec. 1, final deadline Feb. 1  
Applications received by the early priority deadline will be given preference.
- About the Award:** The Peace Corps Coverdell Fellowship includes a discount to in-state tuition rates (if applicable) plus a graduate assistantship. Read more information about the [assistantship requirements](#). In the third semester, there is an internship requirement as well.
- Qualifications:** The Impact MBA Scholarship Committee awards up to two of these fellowships based on the merit of the applicant. You must be accepted into the Impact MBA program to be considered for the award. You must maintain good academic standing (3.0 or higher) in order to keep the award.
- To Apply:** Please indicate in your resume on your application to the Impact MBA program that you were a Peace Corps Volunteer, and complete the application for a [Graduate Assistantship](#). Please note that the information provided in the assistantship application will be used for matching you to a professor or unit, but the award decision will be based on your application to the Impact MBA program.

## Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) Program

- Award Amount:** Colorado State University offers four program awards to cover one half of nonresident tuition (approximately \$12,000), for fall and spring enrollment only, to graduate students of any discipline.
- About the Award:** APEC Program Awards expand education and training opportunities for students, especially women, from developing economies. Applicants must be from any Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) economy. See the member list below.
- Qualifications:** In order to be considered for the APEC Program Award, applicants must first be admitted to a degree-seeking, on-campus, graduate level program at Colorado State University.

- Deadline:** Early priority deadline Dec. 1, final deadline Feb. 1

Matthew's father, Carl Hammerdorfer, was the first director of this unique MBA program and Matthew's mother, Kathy Lynch, worked in Education Abroad. - Qualifications:** You must be a citizen of a country within the African continent, and be accepted into the Impact MBA program to be considered for a scholarship. You must maintain good academic standing (3.0 or higher) in order to keep the award.
- To Apply:** You must complete the application found at this site: CSU Scholarship Applications (CSUSA). The CSUSA will be available online on your RAMweb beginning Dec. 1.

## The Rowe Fund

- Award Amount:** Interest-free loans of up to US\$15,000 dollars.
- About the Award:** An educational loan program of the Organization of American States (OAS) that helps citizens from Latin America and Caribbean OAS Member States finance their studies or research in accredited universities across the United States by awarding **interest-free loans** of up to US\$15,000 dollars.
- Qualifications:** You must be a citizen of a Latin America and Caribbean OAS Member State.
