

Entrepreneurship & Innovation Minor Checksheet

The Entrepreneurship & Innovation Minor helps develop the skills you need to identify problems, create business solutions to address them and capitalize on untapped opportunities. The entrepreneurial mindset – of challenging the status quo, launching new ideas, and finding solutions to complex problems – is applicable in any industry, across startups and large corporations, nonprofits and everything in between. The Entrepreneurship & Innovation Minor is designed for students like you, who are passionate about engaging in the world of entrepreneurship. Admission to the minor is competitive, so you will need to complete an application and meet eligibility requirements.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Students must be in sophomore standing for acceptance into the minor (30 credits).
- Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.500 for acceptance into the minor.

Application Process:

- Students must submit a completed application, online, by the stated deadline. Late applications are not accepted. Applications are accepted during a limited time frame in fall and spring (opening the first day of the term and closing prior to the start of the following term's registration). Minor Requirements:

- Students must satisfactorily complete 24 credits, minimum, with 12 or more credits being upper-division (300- to 400-level).
- Students must complete each course in the minor with a grade of C or better.
