## Electives • 30-33 Credits

Electives can be any course, not already completed, not already required, nor the equivalent of any completed or required course. The number of elective credits required depends upon concentration, and Business Core & AUCC courses taken. The number of needed Upper Division credits vary by concentration. Work with your academic advisor to ensure that you are meeting requirements.

## Graduation Requirements

All Business courses and required Non-Business courses must be taken for a letter grade unless the course is only offered as Pass/Fail. Only Free Electives may be taken Pass/Fail if offered as Student Option Grading and are limited to one course per semester. Degree requirements include: 2.0 cumulative/University GPA, 2.0 major/College GPA, 42 of 120 credits upper division [300+ level] (30 credits must be taken in residence), 50% of total required Business credits must be earned at or through Colorado State University, and 15 of the last 30 credits must be in residence. University policy requires that students graduate under the curriculum in place at the time of their graduation.
